INTRODUCTION

PENITENCE Jesus says, 'I am the light of the world. He who follows me shall not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.' Let us then bring our secret sins into his light and confess them in penitence and faith.

Let us kneel and confess our sins to God our Father.

Almighty God, our Father, we come to you in sorrow and humility to confess our sins:
For turning away from you, and ignoring your will for our lives:

Father, forgive us, **Save us and help us.**

For behaving just as we wish, without thinking of you:

Father, forgive us, **Save us and help us.**

For failing you not only by what we have done, but also by our thoughts and by what we have said:

Father, forgive us, **Save us and help us.**

For letting ourselves be drawn away from you by temptations in the world about us: Father, forgive us, **Save us and help us.**

For acting as if we are ashamed to belong to your dear Son Christ Jesus:

Father, forgive us, **Save us and help us.**

A priest pronounces this absolution: In the name of Jesus I declare to you: You are forgiven; your sins are gone. Be strong in the Holy Spirit, and live for God. **Amen.**

Let us praise God for his mercy.

And give thanks to him for his goodness.

Glory to the Father and to the Son: and to the Holy Spirit.

As it was in the beginning, is now: and shall be for ever. Amen.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

Readings

Psalm 84

1 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!

**2 My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the Lord;
my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God.**

3 Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God.

Saint Luke 2:22-40

[Simeon Praises the Lord]

²² The time came for Mary and Joseph to do what the Law of Moses says a mother is supposed to do after her baby is born.

They took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem and presented him to the Lord, ²³ just as the Law of the Lord says, “Each first-born baby boy belongs to the Lord.” ²⁴ The Law of the Lord also says parents have to offer a sacrifice, giving at least a pair of doves or two young pigeons. So that is what Mary and Joseph did.

²⁵ At this time a man named Simeon was living in Jerusalem. Simeon was a good man. He loved God and was waiting for him to save the people of Israel. God's Spirit came to him

²⁶ and told him that he would not die until he had seen Christ the Lord.

²⁷ When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple to do what the Law of Moses says should be done for a new baby, the Spirit told Simeon to go into the temple. ²⁸ Simeon took the baby Jesus in his arms and praised God,

²⁹ “Lord, I am your servant, and now I can die in peace, because you have kept your promise to me. ³⁰ With my own eyes I have seen what you have done to save your people, ³¹ and foreign nations will also see this. ³² Your mighty power is a light for all nations, and it will bring honour to your people Israel.”

³³ Jesus' parents were surprised at what Simeon had said. ³⁴ Then he blessed them and told Mary, “This child of yours will cause many people in Israel to fall and others to stand. The child will be like a warning sign. Many people will reject him, ³⁵ and you, Mary, will suffer as though you had been stabbed by a dagger. But all this will show what people are really thinking.”

[Anna Speaks about the Child Jesus]

³⁶ The prophet Anna was also there in the temple. She was the daughter of Phanuel from the tribe of Asher, and she was very old. In her youth she had been married for seven years, but her husband died. ³⁷ And now she was 84 years old. Night and day she served God in the temple by praying and often going without eating. ³⁸ At this time Anna came in and praised God. She spoke about the child Jesus to everyone who hoped for Jerusalem to be set free.

[The Return to Nazareth]

³⁹ After Joseph and Mary had done everything that the Law of the Lord commands, they returned home to Nazareth in Galilee. ⁴⁰ The child Jesus grew. He became strong and wise, and God blessed him.
